2023 AK PENINSULA/CHIGNIK BOF



S. Unimak and Shumagin Islands June Fishery

- No change to set gillnet or drift gillnet gear scheduled fishing periods during June fishery.
- Purse seine gear reduction for two periods
- Chum Salmon "trigger" of 300,000 fish by June 18 and 450,000 by June 23
- Sanak Island section closed for all gear during June
- Retain RC 104 for Chignik sockeye in Shumagins

BOF CONTINUED...



Misc Changes

- 25 fathoms of seine webbing may be used on the shoreward end of a set gillnet
- Orzinski Bay openings can be based on Orzinski Lake sockeye escapement
- Monofiliment can be used by set gillnet gear in the Northern District

October BOF Worksession

- ACR 2 Reduce fishing time and repeal chum salmon harvest triggers
- ACR 3 Reduce seine depth in Unimak and Southwestern Districts
- Both ACR's failed

2023 SEASON SUMMARY



- Fishing effort slightly below average
- Escapement goals achieved in the North and South AK Pen management areas
- Price per pound below average
- Enforcement was increased during the South Unimak and Shumagin Is. June fishery
- Implementation of the June portal and fleet adaptive management








SOUTH PEN PINK SALMON ESCAPEMENT








SOUTH PEN CHUM SALMON ESCAPEMENT

 - Chum harvest triggers
 - Fishing period reductions based on Chignik early run
- Pink forecast not developed yet...but
 - 2022 pink salmon escapement exceeded goal
 - Anticipate good escapement and harvest opportunity in 2024
